## BHA CONSULTATION ON WORKING BETTER TOGETHER

The BHA is undertaking a consultation process and we have received the 16 page discussion paper and the 17 page questionnaire addressing a number of issues relating to how the BHA and Groups work together. The deadline for this 31<sup>st</sup> January.

Much of the questionnaire is concerned with collecting simple factual information e.g. age of group, numbers, frequency of meetings etc. but also included are several questions which may radically affect the future structure of the BHA and groups.

- New political and economic environment
- Growth in BHA members, supporters and ceremonies
- More players in the field

**24. The paper gives four criteria against which the success of any change to the relationship between the BHA and local groups could be judged:**

- Enable local groups to play their part in pursuing the BHA's strategy locally. Allow the BHA to pursue its strategy locally
- Meet the needs of local groups
- Be supported as a result by the great majority of (ideally all) local groups and other stakeholders, and by the BHA Board and Management. (It must be a "win-win")
- Be able to be implemented in practice in a reasonable time (say by January 2012) without absorbing too much effort on either side
- Not add significantly to costs or resource demands without compensating by increased revenue, increased resources, or diversion of existing resources.
